1. This hearing has been done through hybrid mode.
2. The present petition challenges the impugned order dated 2nd September, 2022 by which an interest demand of Rs. 91,40,383/- is sought to be imposed upon the Petitioner.
3. The case of the Petitioner is that for the same time period i.e. July, 2017 to March, 2018, two other notices and consequent orders have already been passed, one by the Delhi GST and one by the Central GST, imposing similar interest demands upon the Petitioner.
4. The Court has perused all the three orders. It is clear that there is overlapping in these cases.
5. Accordingly, issue notice. Notice is accepted by Ms. Gupta, Id Counsel and Ms. Khatri, Id. Counsel. Let a counter affidavit be filed within four weeks.



Rejoinder, thereto, be filed within two weeks.

6. Ld. counsel for the Petitioner submits that in respect of the order dated 9th December, 2023 passed by the Delhi GST and the order dated 31st January, 2025 passed by Central GST, the Petitioner is already in appeal before the appellate authority.
7. Under such circumstances, no coercive measures shall be taken in respect of recovery of any amount under the impugned order i.e., order dated 2nd September, 2022. All other proceedings shall continue.
8. List before the Joint Registrar on 12th August, 2025 for completion of pleadings.
9. List before Court on 14th October, 2025.
